- "Conditional Modes of Love and Stump on Sacrifice" In this paper I offer a friendly amendment to Eleonore Stump's model of sacrifice according to which sacrifices are accepted by God because they affect our (human) psychological openness to union with him rather than because they bring about any change in the world around us. I suggest that Stump's psychological openness model is helpful but incomplete since it leaves normative issues of atonement left unaddressed. In support of this I offer three features of the biblical narratives—(i) that they treat sacrifice is a process composed of several events rather than a single event, (ii) that the blood application of such rites focuses on *life* rather than the death which precedes it, and (iii) that the apostles had to wait until the exaltation before the Holy Spirit was sent at Pentencost—that are explained much better by the inclusion of a normative obstacle to union with which sacrifice is meant to deal. And I close by suggesting how we ought to conceive of this normativity.
- "Epistemic Existentialist Faith" In this paper, I set out a new model of faith in conversation with the contemporary literature. The various elements of this account are these: (i) faith is fundamentally an affective state, (ii) faith can be motivated, and rendered broadly rational, on the basis of primarily practical reasons, but (iii) even so, because faith commitments create epistemic reasons to believe various faith-related propositions, faith remains a proper target of epistemic assessment.
- "How to Be a Conciliar Relative Identity Trinitarian" Relative Identity theories of the trinity solve the so-called logical problem of the Trinity by claiming that the identity relations articulated in the Athanasian Creed are relative identity relations. This claim has resulted in two different charges of unorthodoxy: such theorists are charged, first, with Arianism because it

seems as if the divine essence is divine in virtue of different facts than those that explain the divinity of the persons (thereby resulting in multiple senses of 'divinity') and, second, with Sabellianism since it seems to follow from their relative identity relations that the Father is the same person as the Son. I explain that relative identity theorists can avoid both entailments if they adopt certain aspects of non-classical logic that allow for non-transitive relative identity relations.

"Contradictory Theology: A Formal and Historical Overview" – Contradictory theology characterizes any form of theology that includes truths of the form $A \& \sim A$. This article explains different forms of contradictory theology—forms that are differentiated mostly by their understanding of logical consequence and theory-specific consequence relations—and identifies historical precedents to such theology in different religious traditions.

"Social Ontology and the Measurement of Flourishing" – Empirical studies in flourishing communities have been developed recently in hopes of moving from the individualistic focus of much empirical work on flourishing in the last decade. The most significant measure of such flourishing, the *Communal Subjective Well-Being* (CSWB) measure by epidemiologist Tyler VanderWeele, captures important aspects of group flourishing, but I argue in this paper that if we attend to distinctions in social ontology between mere collections of agents and more robust groups with group-level decision procedures, the focus on group member self-reports of group-level flourishing in the CSWB will not adequately capture collective flourishing.
